Updates from the NEXTLOG project

After a successful training which was organized in April 2022, the NEXTLOG partners and the invited participants gathered online in the 2nd round of the training, in order to showcase their final presentations based on the 3 DISL (Digital, Intelligent, Sustainable Logistics) course areas. The session was also co-organized by the project coordinators from the University of Lodz and included a total of 16 presentations for all 3 areas:

- 4 presentations on **Area 1**: Sustainability as a service in supply chains & the manager of the future,
- 6 presentations on **Area 2**: New Technologies in Logistics,
- 6 presentations on **Area 3**: Intelligent logistics and transportation systems.

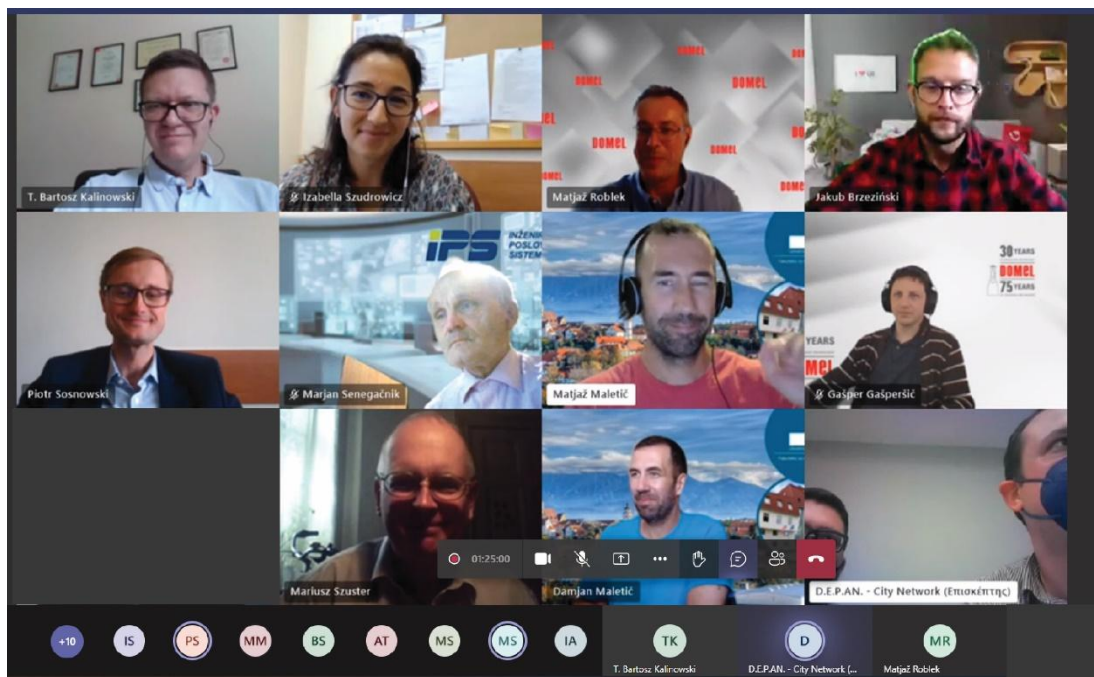


Image 1. Screenshot from the 'Final Presentations' online event: Participants

The presentations were evaluated by Dr T. Bartosz Kalinowski (University of Lodz), Dr. Matjaž Maletič (University of Maribor) and Dr. Dilay Celebi Gonidis (CITY College- University of York, South East European Research Centre – SEERC).

Overall, the participants have exhibited great examples which provided them the opportunity to get a deeper understanding of the potential integration and implementation of DISL. The feedback from the evaluators aimed to provide the trainees with guidance and a better understanding of the practices that they have presented during the event. It also generated further input that helped the trainees when preparing the Good Practice Reports, which were submitted after the final presentation.

Multiplier Event

On September 14th, 2022, a multiplier event was organized by the University of Maribor, Faculty of Organizational Sciences in order to share the intellectual results of the project with a large international audience. Accordingly, in conjunction with the 2nd International Summer School «Organization, Management and Society», the results of the NEXTLOG project are presented and discussed with the audience.
